Time Commitment

Time commitments vary between units but a typical range is:

- one training night per week/fortnight
- on average one weekend every two months
- attend callouts when you are available.

Attributes

- enthusiasm
- positive attitude
- team orientated
- committed to serving the community
- responsible and mature approach
- good moral character.

Responsibilities are likely to include:

- attending callouts whenever possible
- following instructions given by your Team Leader
- correct operation and care of equipment
- attending unit meetings regularly
- participating in regular training.

Standards

- attend training regularly and be available for emergencies and callouts
- follow all reasonable directions of those officers of FESA and SES placed in authority
- wear the SES uniform only during authorised training and operations
- maintain the good name of SES
- maintain in good order all equipment placed in their charge
- return all clothing and equipment on leaving SES
- advise FESA of any changes to your health that might adversely affect your ability to perform accepted tasks during training and operations.
