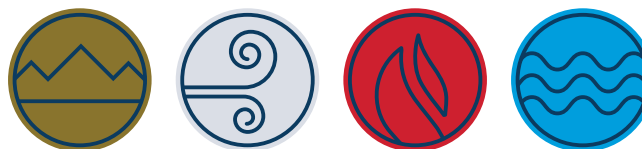

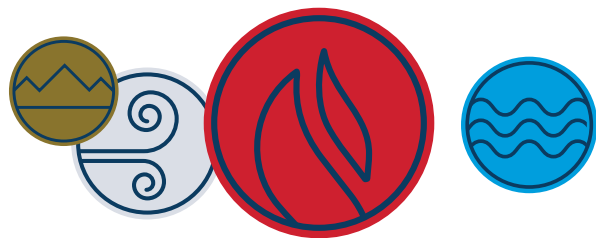


PP – Y2: Emergency Helpers in the Community and Me!

Students learn about DFES' emergency helpers and how they can keep themselves safe in a fire, flood or storm emergency. Fun, interactive group activities help reinforce basic fire, flood and storm safety messages and the importance of triple zero (000).

Y2 – Y6: Home Fire Safety

Students learn how to prevent and respond to a fire emergency in their home. The excursion addresses fire hazards in the kitchen and home, smoke and smoke alarms, crawling low under smoke and having a safe meeting place. There is a focus on home fire escape plans and students are encouraged to complete and practise their plan at home.

Year 3 Home Fire Safety

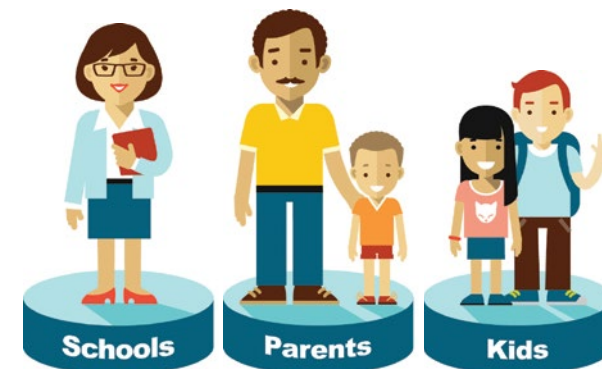
Career firefighters are available to visit Year 3 students in metropolitan Perth and larger regional centres to deliver the Home Fire Safety program. Firefighters deliver key messages on how to prevent and respond to home fires and introduce students to equipment and vehicles used by DFES.
